






Single adult men

61% out of the total

The main countries of origin are Afghanistan (39%), Turkey (15%) Nepal (13%) and Bangladesh (11%).

61% of single adult men declared they intended to seek asylum in Trieste (234 people), confirming the upward trend from previous months.

An average of 12 **new single adult men** were reached every day

Unaccompanied Children (UAC)

12% out of the total

Almost all UACs come from **Afghanistan** (96%).

62% declared they were travelling to other countries and 32% (24 people) asked support to enter the reception system for unaccompanied children in Trieste.

An average of **2 new UACs** were reached every day

Units

out of the total representing 144 individuals (including 74 children)

The main countries of origin are **Turkey** (53%) mainly kurdish, **Syria** (28%) and **Afghanistan** (8%). 4 mothers alone with children met. 59% of the families declared they were travelling to other countries (88% in Germany). 28% of cases have unknown destination.

An average 1 **new family unit** was reached every day

The main countries of origin are **Nepal** (79%) and **Sri Lanka** (15%).

11 single women decided to stop in Trieste and seek for asylum.

An average of 1 **new single adult women** was reached every day

This snapshot shows the numbers of new migrants arriving from the Balkan route encountered by International Rescue Committee Italy and Diaconia Valdese in Trieste central station area during the reporting period. The data was gathered through individual and group interviews with people reached to provide legal orientation and first aid.
