Suggested activities for utilising Culturally Responsive Pedagogy (CRP) in School



Providing multiple perspectives about a topic

Praise for students who have struggled with their learning but persevered

Using diverse topics, examples and images in lessons

Activities where students share their culture



Encouraging debate and questioning of ideas

Using case studies from inside and outside of Britain

Teaching content that gives voice to marginalised groups

Linking abstract/tough concepts to events in students' lives



Encouraging students to share their experiences and knowledge

Praising students who challenge the content and ask deeper questions

Flipped learning activities where students bring their own research

Challenging prejudices which may arise in discussions, explaining why

CRP is focused on getting students into an academic mindset where they are confident challenging content, struggling through parts of their learning and sharing their own perspectives and understandings.
