







People arriving from the Balkan route in Trieste (Italian-Slovenian border)

Single men

66% out of the total

The main countries of origin are Afghanistan (41%), Bangladesh (18%), Pakistan (17%) and Nepal (15%). Among the single men encountered 42% (343 individuals) expressed their intention to apply for asylum in Trieste and 21% (172 persons) in other cities in Italy, while 33% (275 individuals) stated they were travelling to other countries.

An average of **28 new single adult men** were reached every day

Almost all UACs come from Afghanistan 74% (128 individuals) and Egypt 23% (40 Individuals). The majority of UACs reported their intention to reach other countries (67%) and other Italian cities (22%), Milan in particular. Only 11% (19 UACs) expressed the intention to remain in Trieste and access the reception system for unaccompanied children.

43 family units represent 226 individuals (including 115 children). Among them, 7 families were single parents with children. The main country of origin are **Turkey** (64%), predominantly from the Kurdish regions, and **Iraq** (14%). Most families did not disclose their intended destination (43%). Among those who did, 33% reported planning to move to other countries, 11% intended to stay in Trieste, and 11% planned to travel to other cities in Italy.

The main country of origin is **Nepal** (29 persons) representing 88% of total.

19 single women (58%) expressed their intention to apply for asylum in Trieste, ten planned to move to other countries, while the remaining four did not disclose their intentions.

This snapshot shows the numbers of new migrants arriving from the Balkan route encountered by International Rescue Committee Italy and Diaconia Valdese in Trieste central station area during the reporting period. The data was gathered through individual and group interviews with people reached to provide legal orientation and first aid. The monitoring activity is carried out during the entire daytime, and partially in the evening, of every week day of the year, and in the evening on weekends and holidays.
