







People arriving from the Balkan route in Trieste (Italian-Slovenian border)

The main countries of origin are Afghanistan (41%), Pakistan (18%), Bangladesh (18%) and Nepal (13%). Among the single men encountered 39% (242 individuals) expressed their intention to apply for asylum in Trieste and 21% (129 persons) in other cities in Italy, while 35% (220 individuals) stated they were travelling to other countries.

An average of 21 new single adult men were reached every day

Unaccompanied Children (UAC)

Almost all UACs come from Afghanistan (65%) and Egypt (25%). The majority of UACs reported their intention to reach other countries (51%) or other Italian cities (31%), Milan in particular. Only 9 UACs expressed the intention to remain in Trieste and access the reception system for unaccompanied children.

An average of 3 **new UACs** were reached every day

Family Units

24%

52 family units represent 241 individuals (including 102 children). Among them,

2 families were single parents with children. The main country of origin is **Turkey** (66%), predominantly from the Kurdish regions. Most families did not disclose their intended destination (41%). Among those who did, 24% reported planning to move to other countries, 20% intended to stay in Trieste, and 15% planned to travel to other cities in Italy.

An average 2 **new family unit** was reached every day

The main country of origin is **Nepal** (21 persons). Eleven single women expressed their intention to apply for asylum in Trieste, two planned to move to other Italian cities, while the others did not disclose their intentions.

An average of 1 **new single women** was reached every day

This snapshot shows the numbers of new migrants arriving from the Balkan route encountered by International Rescue Committee Italy and Diaconia Valdese in Trieste central station area during the reporting period. The data was gathered through individual and group interviews with people reached to provide legal orientation and first aid. The monitoring activity is carried out during the entire daytime, and partially in the evening, of every week day of the year, and in the evening on weekends and holidays.
