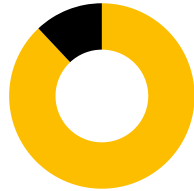

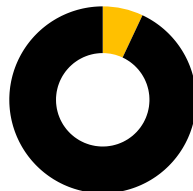

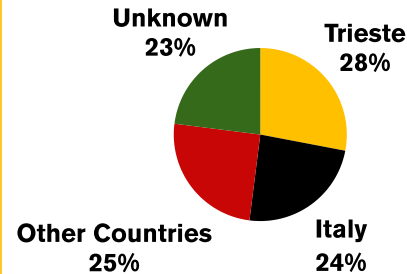

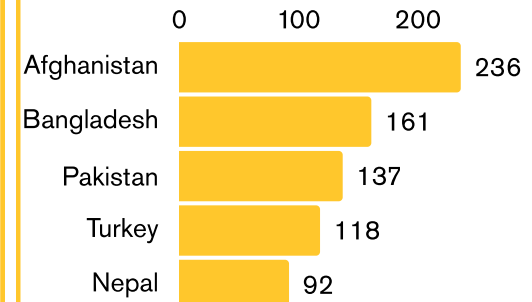

The main countries of origin are **Afghanistan** (26%) **Bangladesh** (23%) and **Pakistan**(15%). Among the single men encountered 32% expressed their intention to apply for asylum in Trieste and 30% in other cities in Italy. While 20 % stated they were travelling to other countries.

An average of **23 new single adult men** were reached every day

The vast majority of unaccompanied children (63%) come from **Afghanistan**. Most of them (65%) reported their intention to reach other countries, mainly Switzerland. In contrast only 16 UACs expressed an intention to remain in Italy (of those 4 specifically in Trieste) and access the reception system.

An average of **2 new UACs** were reached every day

A total of 30 family units represent 125 individuals including 50 children. Among them One family were headed by a single parent. The main countries of origin are **Turkey** (69%) and **Afghanistan** (14%). Regarding their destinations most did not declare where they were heading (53%) which represents a 17% increase from previous records. Meanwhile only 15% reported an intention to stay in Trieste and 32% were moving to other European countries.

An average **1 new family unit** was reached every day

The main countries of origin are **Nepal** (65%) followed by **Myanmar** (12%) and **China** (8%). Out of the women encountered twelve expressed an intention to apply for asylum in Trieste, six planned to move to other countries, 11 planned to move to other cities within Italy, and 8 were heading to an unknown destination.

An average of **1 new single women** was reached every day.

This snapshot shows the numbers of new migrants arriving from the Balkan route encountered by International Rescue Committee Italy and Diaconia Valdese in Trieste central station area during the reporting period. The data was gathered through individual and group interviews with people reached to provide legal orientation and first aid.
